<u>COMMAND:</u> Dr. Haake wanted to remind everyone about the 21st Annual Deaconess Trauma Conference on November 2, 2018 in Evansville, Indiana. Dr. Haake will be one of the presenters and his topic this year is Drugs of Use - Drugs of Abuse. Additional information and registration is available at www.sirems.com.

FINANCE: Nothing new on the grant or finance front this month.

LOGISTICS: IDPH has approved our latest addition to the SIREMS protocol set, the environmental temperature control policy. In an attempt to maintain the quality and efficacy of the pre-hospital medications and injectable fluids given to our patients, we are requiring each service to develop a policy to keep them stored at "Controlled Room Temperature" (59° - 86°F). Every medication and injectable fluid has a recommended storage temperature and we urge services to follow the manufacturer's guidelines. However, Controlled Room Temperature is a range recognized by the United States Pharmacopeia, the Committee on Accreditation of Ambulance Services, and others as a general storage temperature target. Since each service is different, there is flexibility within the protocol for each department to create a policy that works logistically and financially for them. We encourage front line, supervisory, and administrative staff to collaborate to find the best solution for your departments. If you have any questions, please contact the EMS Office.

Reminder: Even if you work full time in another EMS System, you must supply the EMS Office with your renewal CEUs for review. Even if you renew through another system, we have to review your CEUs to ensure compliance with our policies. Contact the EMS Office with any questions.

<u>OPERATIONS:</u> For the transport agencies that early activate Code Stroke cases, the SIH Stroke Program has extended the window between last known well time and early activation to 24 hours. It was previously a 6 hour window, but advances in care of large vessel occlusions have warranted the expansion to 24 hours. If you have any questions, contact the EMS Office.

Please be mindful of pedestrians while driving or responding to calls for service. The weather is cooling off and the numbers of bicyclists and pedestrians is increasing. Pay careful attention the week of Halloween due to some costumes and decorations causing blind spots and limiting visibility.
