
FINANCE: Has your agency ever considered retail partnerships? I'm sure you have been asked if you would like to round up your purchase for a good cause. Maybe a business would be interested in dedicating a percentage of the sales to your department. This may be one strategy to consider when attempting to purchase an ambulance or expensive piece of equipment.

LOGISTICS: For agency administrators: When your equipment suppliers need an updated physician authorization form, here's the process to get that updated. First, complete the account and department information on the top of the form. Then, email or fax that form to the EMS Office. From there, we will add the information from Dr. Haake's physician license, add his signature, and send the completed form to the supplier. If there are questions, please contact the EMS Office.


For services planning on purchasing an ambulance, please notify the EMS Office. The service must complete a system modification form to add the new vehicle to their fleet. The new ambulance must be inspected by IDPH and SIREMS within 10 days of being placed in service. And, IDPH has made some changes to the administrative rules regarding ambulance build and labeling. It would be best to touch base with the EMS Office and the Southern Inspector, Beau Elam before completing the outfitting or graphics.

OPERATIONS: Remember that tears or breaks in any upholstered surfaces in the patient compartment of the ambulance is a violation of IDPH rules. Placing tape over the damaged area is not an adequate repair. Please have any damaged areas in upholstery properly repaired or replaced.

Trauma Activations from the field are classified as either Category 1 or Category 2. Category 1 trauma activations are based on physiological findings, either the type of injuries or findings with blood pressure, pulse, respiratory rate, and mental status.



Category 2 trauma activations are based solely on mechanism of injury.
